What we know today?

Drivers seem not to be really putting down their phone

More laws and more fines ...

Effective enforcement seems to be difficult

We still don't have credible data on cell phone related crashes

We don't know the impact of all these bans

The road from causation to prevention is challenging

Risk aversion tends to be very pervasive

Bad beginnings (causation studies) complicates this journey
