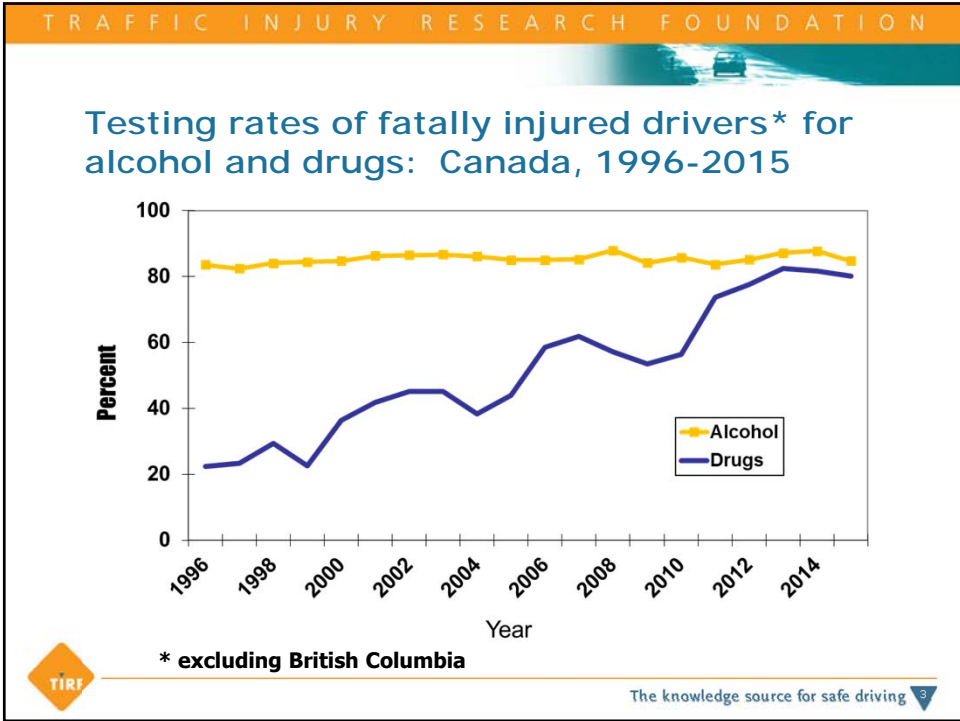

## TIRF Fatality Database

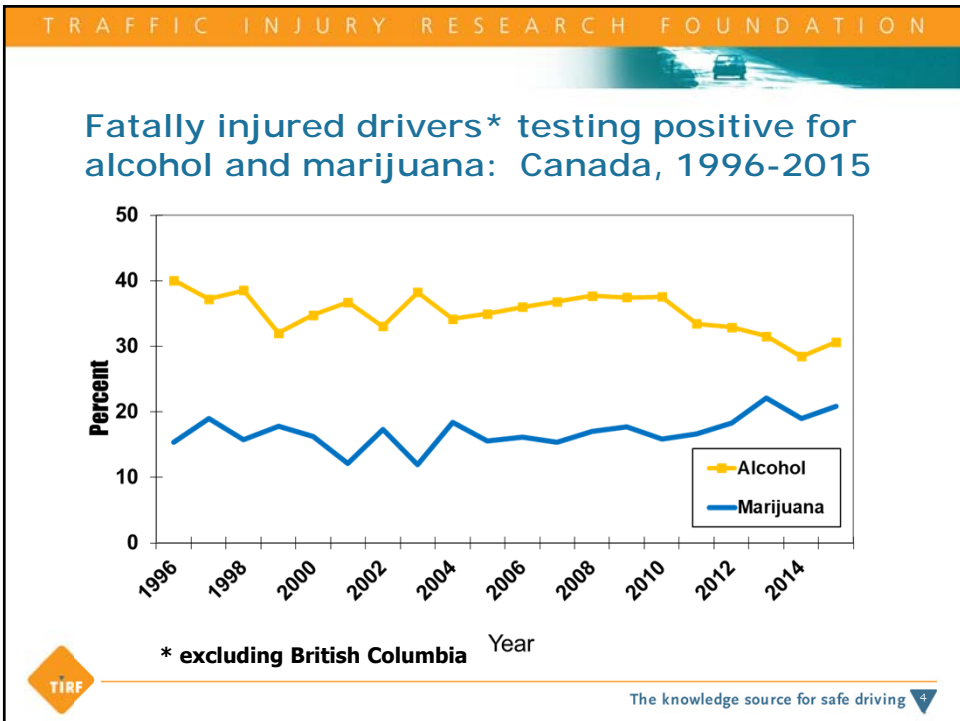
- > Only fatal collision database in Canada that matches police-reported collision data with coroner/medical examiner data.
- > Sponsors include Desjardins and Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators (CCMTA).
- > Includes alcohol and drug data.
- > Drug data for over-the-counter, prescription and illicit drugs.

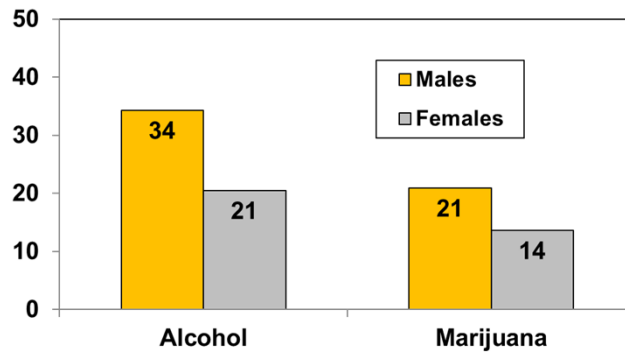

### Percent of fatally injured drivers positive for alcohol and marijuana by sex: Canada, 2011-2015

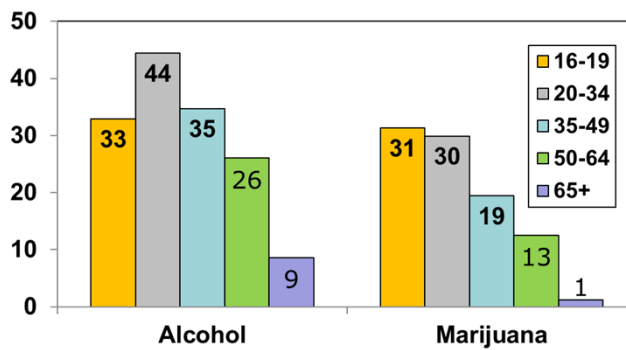

### Percent of fatally injured drivers positive for alcohol and marijuana by age group: Canada, 2011-2015

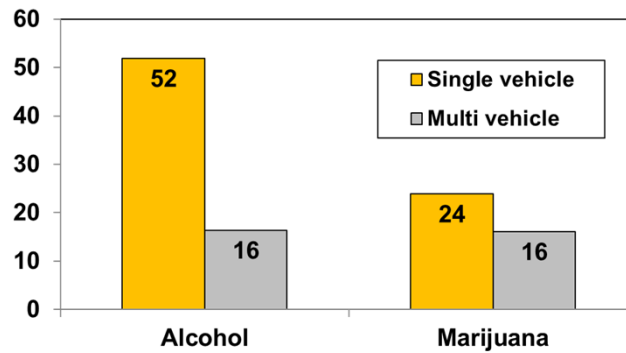

### Percent of fatally injured drivers positive for alcohol and marijuana by collision type: Canada, 2011-2015

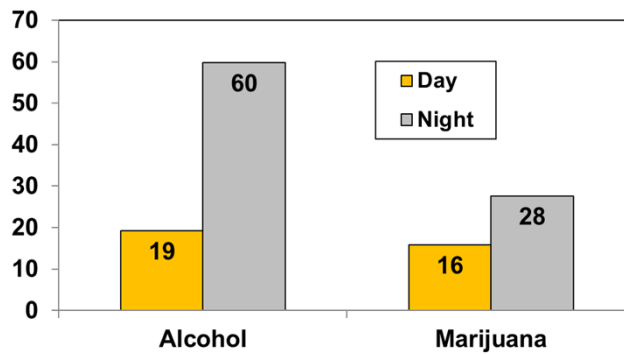
