- RSP exams offered 3 times/year
- **February 1-28:** application deadline: December 5
- **June 1-30:** application deadline: **April 4**
- **October 1-31:** application deadline: August 6

Level 1 Exam:
Pre-Requisites

- Bachelor's degree from accredited university and minimum of two (2) years' experience transportation, highway safety or public health

OR

- minimum of four (4) years' experience transportation, highway safety or public health

Level 2 Exam:
Pre-Requisites

- Successful completion of Level 1 exam

AND

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited university and minimum of five (5) years experience in transportation, highway safety or public health

OR

- minimum of ten (10) years experience transportation, highway safety or public health

Road Safety Professional

The Transportation Professional Certification Board (TPCB) in collaboration with a wide array of transportation- and safety-related organizations in the United States and Canada announces the availability of a new Road Safety Professional (RSP) Certification beginning in October 2018. The goals of the RSP certifications are to recognize road safety as a profession, to establish a recognized level of practice and knowledge, and to incentivize safety education.

With more than 40,000 lives lost annually on highways in the United States and Canada and the growing attention on improving public safety through initiatives such as Toward Zero Deaths, Vision Zero, and the Road to Zero, the RSP represents an important step forward for the safety profession. The RSP certification provides for professionals involved in a wide array of safety-related disciplines to establish their competency in providing for the safety of the traveling public.

This certification has two levels.



Level 1: Those achieving Level 1 certification will have demonstrated proficiency in the foundations of road safety principles. The exam is for a broad audience of professionals who in the performance of their work make decisions or take actions that potentially impact the safety of the traveling public. This includes those in the engineering, motor vehicle, behavioral, law enforcement, and emergency response communities. The first Level 1 exam will take place in October 2018.

Level 2: This certification is geared toward professionals whose primary job functions are directed at improving the safety performance of the surface transportation system. It is
